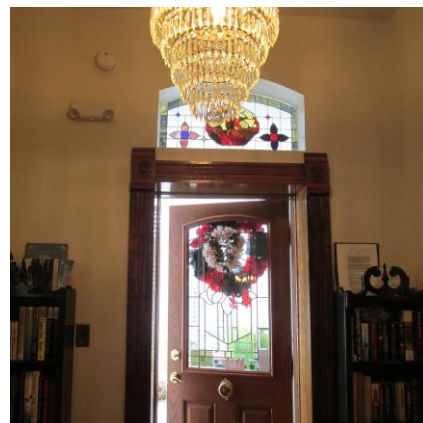

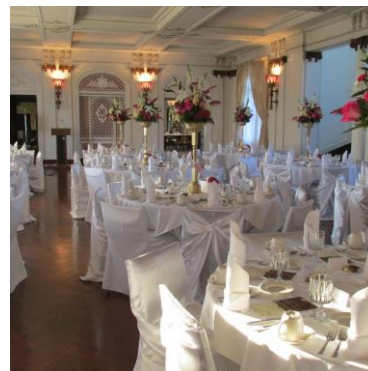
Great Gatsby Gala III
